Kam Kam Dunes

We are a nomadic camp equipped with eleven tents and one suite royal *-traditional nomadic Berber tents-* built with organic dromedary leather and handmade by local artisans.


Each tent (24m²) has a private bathroom with hot water shower and possibility to accommodate two or three adults.

Kam Kam Dunes are not only exclusive tents. The camp has a dinning tent and a chill-out area with views over Erg Chebbi Desert.

Enjoy a cosy, stylish and warm atmosphere surrounded by an authentic experience, and loyal to the traditions of the Sahara Berber region.

The new Kam Kam Suites Concept

Kam Kam Suites opened in October 2018.

It's a new nomadic camp equipped with four tents built with organic dromedary leather and handmade by local artisans.


It's a camp five minutes walking from Kam Kam Dunes.

Kam Kam Suites is between two very big dunes, so the traveller will have the feeling of being lost inside the desert.

There are less tents to give more intimacy and privacy to the traveller.

Tents are twice bigger than original Kam Kam Dunes. Kam Kam Suites tents are 50m² and can accommodate from one to four adults.







How to arrive in Kam Kam Dunes

SELF • DRIVING

Travelling in a regular car:

Your meeting point will be at the only **petrol station in Merzouga "Afriquia"** where our guide will be waiting for you.

Afterwards he will escort you to a car park where you can safely leave your car. From there a 4x4 car

transfer is provided to travel to **Kam Kam Dunes.**

On the following day a transfer will be provided to drive you back to the car park to collect your car (free of charge).

*Remember to call us two hours in advanced to inform about the arrival time.

Travelling in a 4x4 or SUV car:

This is the most adventurous and exciting way to arrive.

Your meeting point will be at the only **petrol station in Merzouga "Afriquia"** where our guide will be waiting for you.

Our guide will then get in your car with you and give you some basic

lessons on how to drive your car across the desert. After that he will direct you towards **Kam Kam Dunes.**

Usually your car's tyre pressure will need to be decreased to ensure greater ease of driving.

Please ensure that you know how to activate the 4x4 mode of your car.

*Remember to call us two hours in advanced to inform about the arrival time.

Travelling with a hired driver:

Please ask your driver to contact us in advance.

IMPORTANT: Please on the arrival day call us in the morning when you leave from your hotel, so we can be in touch all the time! Kindly call us again two hours before you arrive in Merzouga. (Usually two hours before is when you are approaching the city, "ERFOUD"). The meeting point will be in the AFRIQUIA petrol station in Merzouga. Once there we will organise the transfer into the desert

Remember that we don't serve lunch in Kam Kam Dunes, therefore the check-in time is always after lunch at 3pm.

Note: Travellers might be teamed up with other groups during transfer, plus you may have to wait to be transferred in a specific time within a time frame. We ask you to be patient.



It is the sort of service local people would use to get to Merzouga, it does not stop to visit any sight.

• Daily departures **from Marrakech** start at 8:30am and arrive in Merzouga at 21:00pm.

• From Fez the night bus will leave at 20:30pm and arrives at 7:15am in Merzouga. If you want to take this

bus and do an **early check-in** you will need to pay 60€ per person (minimum 2 persons), and it will include a tour across the dunes and lunch in a restaurant.

Alternatevely you can stop in Rissani and visit the city and have lunch there. Then take our **Rissani** transfer service to the camp (50€ per car).

ERRACHIDIA AIRPORT



The nearest airport is at Errachidia (ERH) Airport. There are regular flights in the Royal Air Maroc Airlines coming from Casablanca.

Recently there is a new flight from Fez with Air Arabia Airlines.

Transfer from ERH airport to Kam Kam Dunes (40 minutes) can be provided at 100€ per car both ways. If budget is not an issue, and you want to get to Kam Kam Dunes with style, then a **helicopter or private** plane is your best choice. We don't offer them directly but you can hire them at:







DIFFERENCES BETWEEN SHARED AND PRIVATE TOUR

We recommend taking a 3 night
4 day tour if you want to enjoy

more time in the desert.

- If you only do one night in Kam Kam Dunes usually ATV cannot be done since the station is closed when the bus leaves.

- The arrival in the desert is usually late so the camel ride will be done at sunrise

> *We only organise the desert tour, client must book hotels and flights to Morocco.

Taking a shared tour from Marrakech to Kam Kam Dunes allows travel agents around the city to combine groups and individuals (12-15 persons) in order to share costs and this undoubtedly makes it the most affordable way to reach Kam Kam Dunes.

The bus itself is safe and slightly more comfortable than the regular public bus, but you will be mixed with other budget tours.

Unfortunately, you need to collect other travellers from various points around the city.

Having stopped in a number of shops and souvenir stalls en-route, and visiting some interests sights like Ait Ben Haddou you should reach Kam Kam Dunes in the early evening and if you are staying for one night, the bus will return to Marrakech the next morning (Marrakech drop off is in Jemaa el- Fnaa place).

Taking a

Shared tours are a wonderful way to keep your budget in check but they do require patience so while you do receive a good deal in terms of price, these reduced costs are at the expense of accommodating the rest of the group in your schedule, less flexibility and maybe arriving later in the destination.

It is great for students that don't mind to share the transport with other tourists but want to sleep at the best places like Kam Kam Dunes. Unfortunately, this can also mean the shared option is not the most suitable for a one night stay as this late arrival results in a very limited amount of time in Kam Kam Dunes.

If you go for the shared transport it is better to book for two nights at Kam Kam Dunes so that you can enjoy a full day at the desert.

Unforgettable adventure to experience the sensation of loneliness while walking in the middle of the dunes. You will cross from East to West the dunes of Erg Chebbi from Kam Kam Dunes to Hassilabed.

You can do this trek if you already have experience in treks before. If it is your first trek you will need to be a little bit fit.

For example, you can do it if you go to the gym or spinning / cycling twice per week or if you are fit enough to run a 5K or 10K race. The trek starts at 8:00 at Kam Kam Dunes and you will walk with one local guide.

If you want a fully adventure and do it alone at your own risk, it will still have the same price but we can provide you the GPS track and few navigation tips. You will need to do an induction session via Skype with our team prior to book the activity. We will visit a nomadic family and have tea with them. Then, we will do a quick visit to zinc mines nearby the desert. Before lunch, we will visit the town of Khemliya, where the locals will perform a show of a typical Sudanese exotic dance. After a Berber tea, we will go to a Kasbah and enjoy lunch.

Afterwards, we can have a swim in the swimming pool *(only in April-October)* or go on a Quad excursion.

What to expect

The trek starts at 8:00 in the morning in Kam Kam Dunes. You will walk around 5 hours until you reach the village called Hassilabed.

Once there you will have a Moroccan lunch included in the price with water. You can order drinks and pay separately.

The restaurant has a swimmingpool and shower so depending the time of the year you can enjoy that facilities.

After lunch, some tea and rest, you will be transfered via 4WD car to Kam Kam Dunes.

Optionally you can add on ATV/quad experience before you go back to Kam Kam Dunes. The quad tour is around one hour and **50€ per person.**

TRAVEL WITH KIDS

We usually get this question very often: Should we take the kids to the desert?

First of all, we want to make clear that either you are coming from Fez or from Marrakech, it will be a long journey (10 hours road trip). If you start from Marrakech, the route goes across the High Atlas Mountains, stops in Ait Ben Haddou, Ouarzzazate, the Todra Gorges, and Dades Valley before reaching Merzouga. We recommend taking the tour that stops in Dades so you have a waypoint to sleep between the road. If your kids are not used to spending long periods of time in a car, this is going to be very difficult for them. If you're considering a Sahara visit, you MUST take this into consideration.

If you're unsure how they will do, never book a shared tour, because you won't be able to stop when you require. It will be better then to book a private tour, that will allow you to stop as frequently as needed and will not put others on edge. Note that none of the cars will have a secure seat system for your kids.

After the note about the length of time spent in the car, next point is about activities. Essentially, you're driving 10+ hours to see this amazing experience in one of the most remote places of the world. But from a kid's point of view, consider that electronic gadgets won't work. **If your kids aren't the type to spend hours without**

being entertained, then plan accordingly. This can be

Aït Benhaddou has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1987 and several films have been shot there, including Gladiator, Game of Thrones, The mummy etc.

Boumalne Dades is a village in Tinghir Province, Drâa-Tafilalet, Morocco. Located at the outlet of the upper Dadès Valley (more than 1500 m high), Boulmane Dades is between the Roses Valley and Toudra gorgues. It is found between Marrakech and Kam Kam Dunes and it's a very good option to stop and rest from the long road trip from Marrakech to Merzouga, that's why some of our itineraries stop at Dades,

During the night, the desert can become very cold, we advise that all clients should bring: Some warm clothes, warm jumper, jacket, winter pyiama & scarf.

In June and September

Is very hot at the desert, we recommend bringing fresh clothes with organic fabrics, sun cream, swiming suit, sunglasses and cap/hat.

an amazing experience, or a frustrating one!

Usually the arrival time in Kam Kam Dunes is at sunset, then while having dinner we usually have "tajine" and chicken or meat. Take into consideration that kids may not be used to Moroccan food and if they don't like it much, there are very limited options on site. We advise to bring some food with you. Baby highchair is not available. Remember that weather at the desert is very severe, from a sand storm, to very high temperatures during the day and very cold during the night. The kid's buggy will not slide in the sand.

Regarding emergencies, you also must consider that Kam Kam Dunes is located in the desert and the nearest basic "hospital" is in Errachidia (3.5 hours), so you must bring medicines you think you could require. We have a cat and a dog, and we are surrounded by sand, so if you have any allergy you need to be ready for this.

To sum up, if you take the trip as a family adventure and you think that spending some time on the road won't be an issue, plus you and your kids accept all the inconveniences that may occur, handling it in a good way, then you are welcomed to book a tour! From past experiences, even though 9 months babies visited us, we recommend at least kids to be 4 or 5 years old.

Kam Kam Dunes closes in July and August because of the extreme sun, around 50 degrees Celcius and risk of sun stroke in the middle of the dunes. We are opened from September the 6th until June the 30th!!! We don't

Onsite there is no signal in the middle of the desert! So we only accept cash either in Moroccan Dirhams or Euros.

Because many people come with friends all the rooms can be double or triple with separated beds.

Guests can check-in between 3pm and 9pm. Check-out time is around 10 o'clock but we are very flexible if we have availability! Please inform us in advance if you require a late check-out or any other preferences.

You will not be able to be transferred into the desert because the temperature is very high from 16:00 to 18:00 depending on the season, check-in starts when the sun goes down. We strongly recommend checking-in during sunset.

In Kam Kam Dunes we have a dog and a cat as part of our welcome team :) **If you have any animal allergy, please keep that in mind and bring the medicines accordingly.** If you have dust allergy also keep in mind that you will be surrounded by dust and sand so maybe Kam Kam Dunes is not the best place to stay. If you have food allergies also is not possible to quarantee a different

A private tent means that you will have your own tent in the camp. Each tent has a shower and a toilet inside only for you. Kam Kam Dunes has only 12 tents, so we ensure that never gets crowded with many people.

Can we bring a hairdryer?

No, but sometimes and depending on the wind and many factors, you might be able to get 3G signal of ORANGE. So if you have an ORANGE sim card with 3G you may get internet. Forfeits are not expensive,

Usually yes! Sockets are available in the lounge and restaurant areas but not in your tent.

recommend heading inside the desert in summer. Most of the luxury camps are closed because we cannot guarantee a comfortable and safe stay, especially with kids or old people. In June, we recommend only stepping into the the desert once the sun is going down.

In advance, you can pay by Paypal, Alipay, Credit or Debit card or bank transfer via a secure system based in Spain.

If you want a double bed we put two beds together but expect a minimal separation between them. Our tents have $24m^2$ and the suites $50m^2$.

Note that travellers might be teamed up with other groups during transfer, plus you may have to wait to be transferred in a specific time. Check in/out times may be modified for this reason.

If you arrive early, we can organise the tour in the dunes with lunch for 60€ per person. That includes a private driver and lunch in a Kasbah with a nice swimming pool. We NEVER serve LUNCH in the camp.

	Language	The official language is Classical Arabic but Morocco has a distinctive Arabic dialect called Derija that is widely spoken throughout the country, while most of the words find their root in Standard Arabic, some words are borrowed from Spanish, French and Berber. French, Spanish and English are spoken in many cities and popular	towns with tourists. You can usually find someone who understands enough of your own language to get the information you need. Moroccans are very friendly and hospitable, so try saying "salamu 'aleykum" (peace be upon you) and "insh'allah" (God willing).
	People and culture	Moroccans are known for their warmth, humour, openness and sociability. Your experience will be shaped by the great tradition of hospitality during your encounters with ordinary Moroccans, in cosmopolitan cities and remote villages alike. If you are invited to eat with a family, you will typically sit on the floor and eat from a communal plate, placed in the middle of a small table. Eat with	your right hand. Utensils are not used although, as a visitor, you are likely to be offered a fork or spoon. If you are invited to a home you should try to take a small gift such as fruit, nuts or sweet pastries. Although Morocco is considered more relaxed than many other Muslim countries, you still need to be respectful of the culture and traditions of the local people.
	Food	Moroccan cuisine is delicious and offers you traditional dishes such as harira (tasty and nourishing bean soup traditionally served for breakfast), tagine (succulent meat cooked with spices and vegetables in a conical shaped pot), meschui (whole roasted sheep/goat), tangia, a	Marrakech specialty, couscous, fresh salads and fruits, hot steaming bread and other delicacies. Café au lait, or café "nousnous' with pastries is a popular pastime in the street side cafes and mint tea awaits you wherever you go.
	Dress	In the cities of Marrakech, Fez, Agadir, Casablanca etc., Moroccan men and women often dress as they would on the streets of European countries.	We do not recommend that you drink tap water anywhere in Morocco. Excellent bottled mineral water is available everywhere.
	Alcohol	Although we are talking about an Islamic country, alcohol is available, but respect has to be shown by not overdoing it or making a big show.	In the big cities, there are plenty of bars and all modern hotels sell alcohol. Outside of the cities, apart from tourist hotels, alcohol is almost impossible to locate so stock up at the office before you set off. Drugs are totally illegal in Morocco with prison sentences for many years.
	Shopping	Shopping in Morocco can be a challenge rather than a casual pass-time. A visit to the souk (a market consisting of hundreds of tiny shops), will involve sharing a glass of mint tea with the merchants while you examine variety and quality of the craftsmanship, and haggle for a	bargain. All this takes time. Enjoy, it can be a lot of fun. Moroccans are very skilled salesman if you do not want to buy something from every shop that you enter you must learn to say no. If you do not want to buy anything and are approached by a salesman just smile and say "non merci" and walk on.
Guid	es & drivers	Regulations govern guides, drivers and vehicles licensed to work with tourists in Morocco. Each driver and vehicle has to be registered and carry the associated permits. Police checkpoints regularly stop and check for the correct paperwork, Guides are licensed according to district and activity: ie: mountain guides, Marrakech city guides, etc. You will be approached by a self-proclaimed guides commonly known as <i>false guides</i> . Most false guides are just trying to make a small tip and mean you no harm but they can be relentless and persistent in their offer to guide you. False guides are practiced and skilful and you will need to be firm in your insistence that you do not want a guide. If the harassment	continues, do make an obvious attempt to seek out a policeman. You can ask at a nearby shop where you can find the police strict controls have been brought in where being hassled is illegal and the tourist police are constantly on patrol to ensure this is adhered to. We do highly recommend that you consider hiring a licensed guide for tours in Fez and Marrakech. Not only will you not get continually lost, the authorised guides have considerable knowledge of the history and architecture and will ensure you get to experience the many different areas of the medina. The guide will get a commission on anything that you buy. You can make it clear to the guide at the start of the tour what, if any, shopping you are interested in.
	Tipping	Most services are performed with the aim of getting a few dirhams, but aggressive hustling shouldn't be rewarded. Generally a tip of 10 to 20 dirham is suitable for porters, direction givers and photo posers. Restaurants, bars, clubs and coffee shop staff expect tips from	tourists and Moroccans. Assuming satisfactory service, this is usually 25 Moroccan dirhams for small checks, and around 10% for larger checks. Most hospitality staff rely heavily on tips for their income. A tip of 10 to 20% is usual practice for drivers and guides.
	Currency	Moroccan Dirham (MAD o dh): 100 Dirhams are around 9.25 euros. South of Morocco can hardly be paid by credit card. It is advisable to bring dirhams in cash. Euros can be exchanged for dirhams at banks or exchange sites and airports. They can also be	easily withdrawn at ATMs. Many Moroccans accept euros but then the change is 10 dirhams 1 euro. Most people expect tips, it is advisable to carry small coins for these occasions.

Ramadan	Ramadan is the 9th and most important month in the Islamic Calendar, During this time Muslims abstain from eating, drinking or smoking until after sundown on each day. As a traveller, of course you don't need to follow the tradition, but some Muslims appreciate that	you don't take meals or smoke in public places. Many restaurants and cafes won't open until after sundown and public transport may be less frequent, shops close earlier before sunset and the pace of life is generally slower.
Begginig	You will see people begging on the streets and you should consider giving your loose change. Persistent begging is not encouraged, and	once you have refused, if the requests continue, it is OK to ignore them and move on.
Passport	To avoid any problem when arriving in Morocco, check that your passport has an expiry date after the date of travel, at least 3 months. A paper must be filled at the entrance and exit of the Country. It is	important that the PROFESSION box matches in the arrival and departure. No visa required to enter Morocco for Spanish citizens.
Plane	Important for travellers in airplane: always go to the check-in desk to stamp your boarding pass printed at home. The boarding pass must be stamped by the airline before going to the safety control.	Electricity Electricity is like Spain, France or Italy. 220 v, sockets
Hygiene rules	 Never drink non-bottled water, even for brushing teeth. Avoid ice, even if you tell it comes from filtered water. Be very careful with the juices as they sometimes add water. Always ask if they have added water. Always eat peeled fruit. Do not eat lettuce or salad that you suspect may have been washed with running water.
